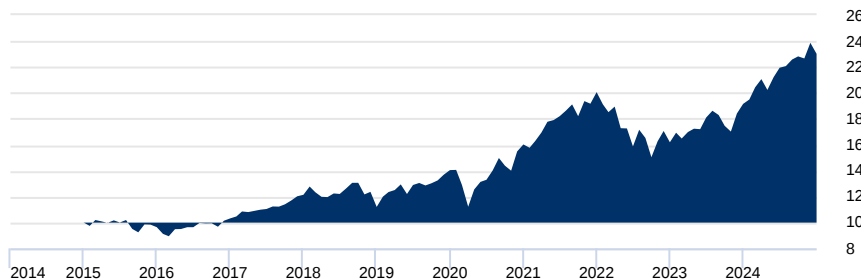

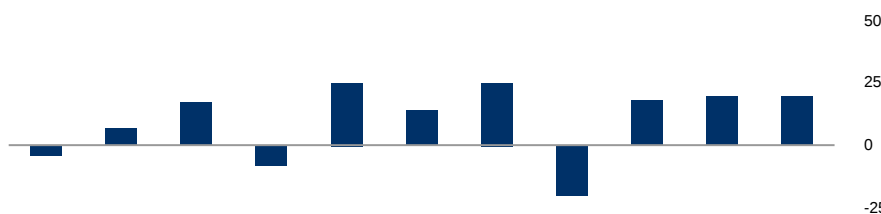
Performance analysis for Series A as of December 31, 2024

Calendar returns %

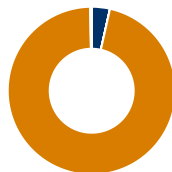
